

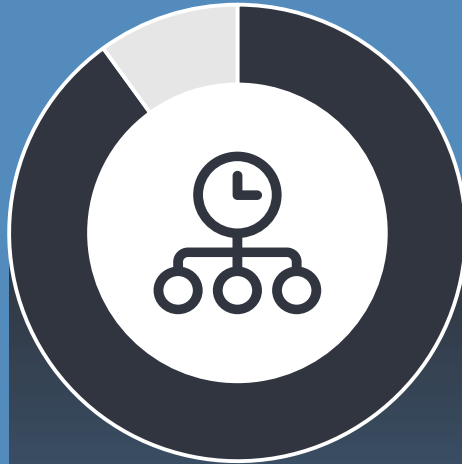

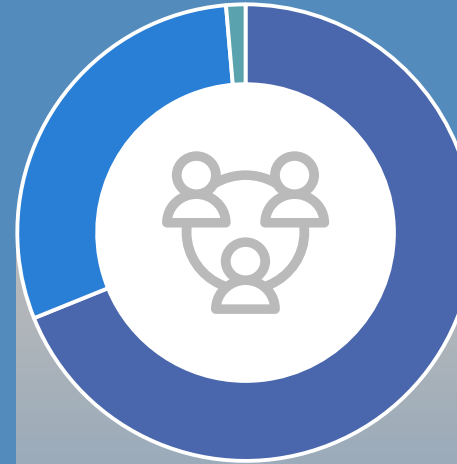

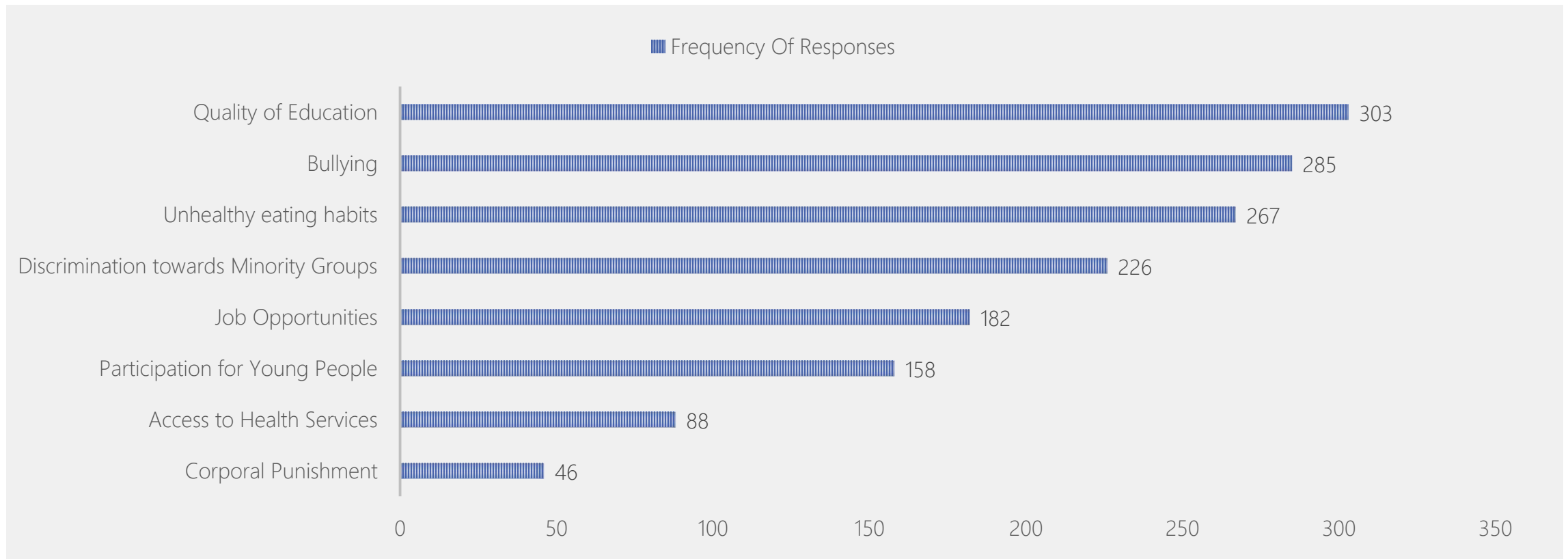

#3 Unhealthy Eating Habits @55.4%

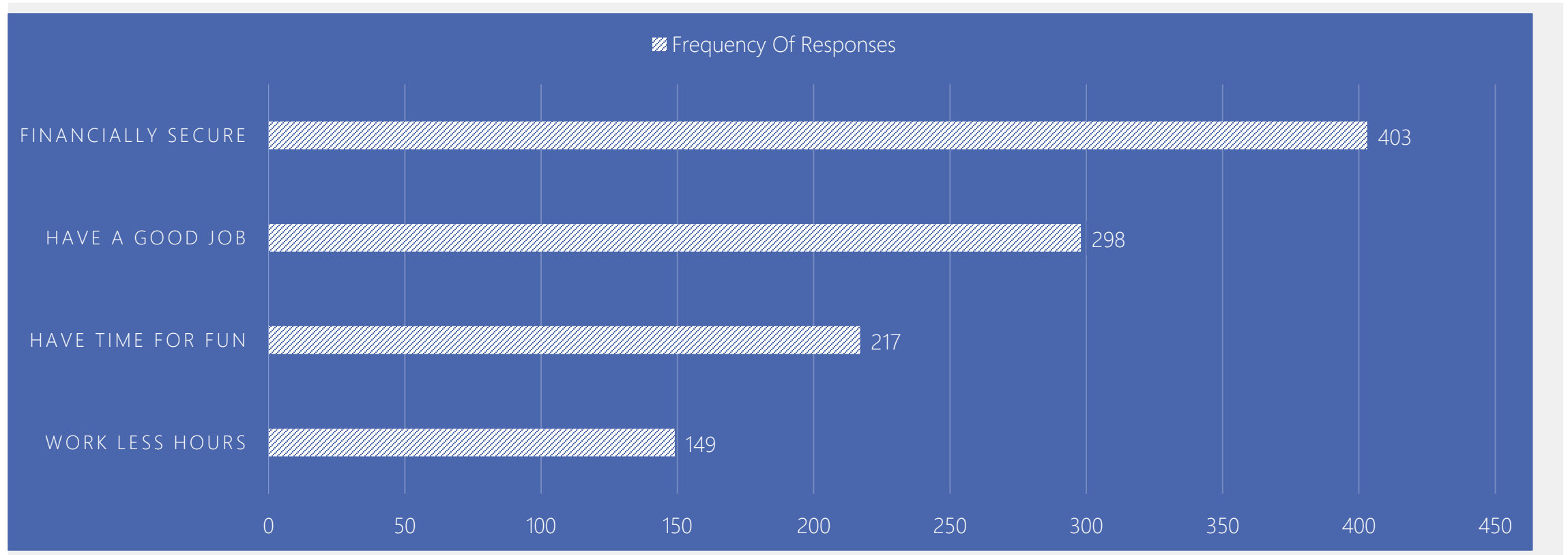


Q2: What is most important for your future?

#3 Have Time For Fun @45.8%

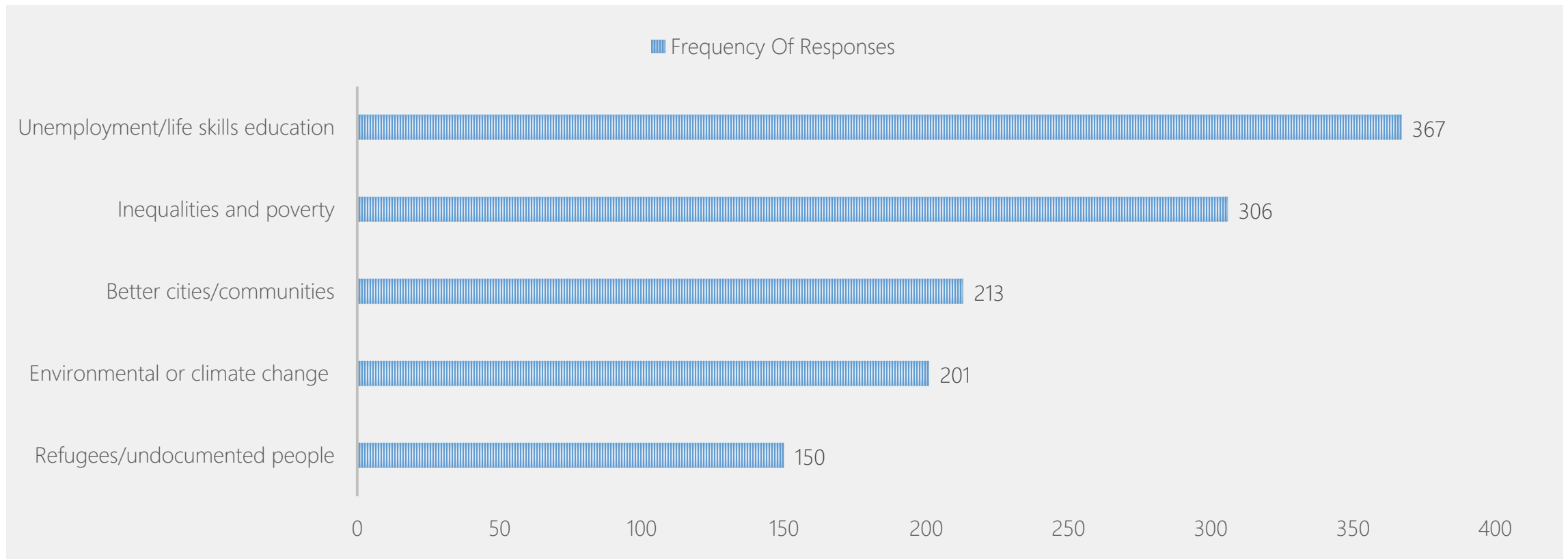


Q3: Critical areas that the Govt should focus on?

#3 Better cities & Communities @46.2%

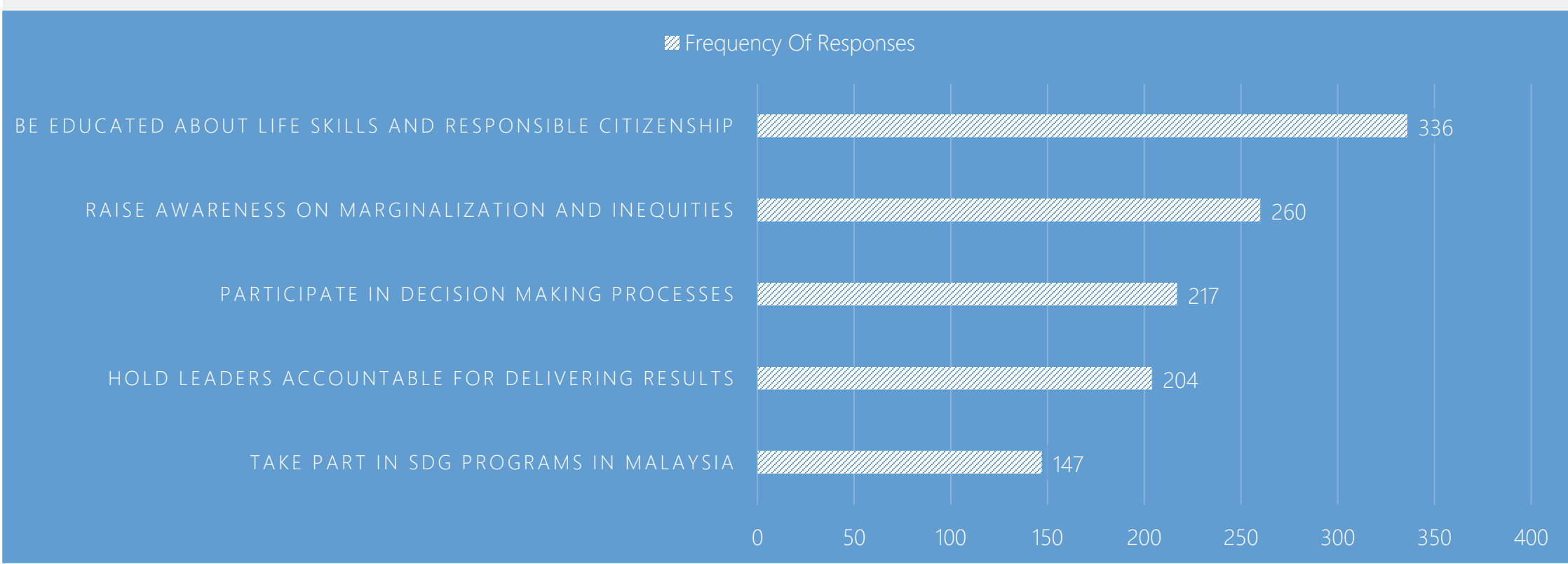


Q4: How can you contribute to a better Malaysia?
