ALAYSIA continued to register a declining trend in the percent-age of population aged 14 years and below, while the number of those in the old age category continued with an upward trend over the past 10

Prime Minister Datuk Seri Ismail Sabri Yaakob yesterday said the percentage of population aged 14 and below, or categorised as young age, dropped to 24 per cent in 2020 compared with 27.6

cent in 2020 compared with 276 per cent in 2010.

In his speech at the launching of the 2020 Malaysia Population and Housing Census main find-ings report, Ismail Sabri said the percentage of population aged 60 and above had increased from eight per cent, or two million peo-ple, in 2010 to 10.4 per cent, or 3.4

cent over 10 years.
"Of the total 32.4 million population, 91.7 per cent are citizens, while 8.3 per cent are non-citizens.
"A total 6.8 per cent of the total population are those

aged 65 years and above, 69.3 per cent in the working age category (between 15 and 64) and the remaining in the young age cat-egory," he said when revealing findings

revealing Indings from the report here.
Present were Minister in the Prime Minister's Department (Economy) Datuk Seri Mustapa Mohamed, newly appointed Public Service Department director-general Datuk Seri Mohd Shafio Abdullah and Statistics De-

Shafiq Abdullah and Statistics Department director-general Datuk Seri Dr Mohd Uzir Mahidin. Also in attendance was Man-agement and Science University

president Tan Sri Professor Dr Mohd Shukri Ab Yajid. Ismail Sabri said the male pop-

ulation outnumbered females with the gender ratio of 110 males per 100 females.

The findings from the census, he said, showed females outnumbered their male counterparts in Putrajaya, where the gender ratio in federal government administrative territory stood at 100 fe-males per 96 males. "This was among the findings


from the 2020 census, which will become the new indicator for the

government to formu late policies related to improving the wellbe-ing of the people. "These findings will
