Move to raise B40 income, reduce poverty

SELLING FOOD IN VENDING MACHINES

Move to raise B40 income, reduce poverty

KUALA LUMPUR: The government is targeting to increase the income of participants in the People's Income Initiative (Instatif Pendapatan Rakyat or IPR) to RM2,000 monthly, in an effort to eradicate poverty.

Economy Minister Rafizl Ramli said the target was set based on a survey conducted by his ministry and referring to the national poverty line.

Proposed under the revised 2023 Budget, Rafizi said IPR was an initiative that involved the collaboration of the government and several strategic partners to increase the income of people

living in hardcore poverty, poverty, as well as people in the B40 income group.

"The ministry has carried out preliminary 'modelling' (over the implementation of IPR). If we looked at all three modules, are entirespensi agro entrepreneurs would take longer to generate and increase

their income," he said.

He was referring to the three modules under the IPR initiative, namely the Agro Entrepreneur Initiative (Intan), Food Entrepreneur Initiative (Insan) and Services Operator Initiative (Ikhsan).

Intan is an initiative to recruit targeted groups that are inter-ested in taking part in agriculture by focusing on crops with high yield and import value, such as chili, ginger and corn. Insan is an initiative focusing

on attracting people who are in-terested to venture in the food industry. Under the initiative, participants will sell food at an affordable price using new approaches, such as the use of vending machines.

As for Ikhsan, it is an initiative aimed at recruiting people who are interested to work as cleaners in effort to reduce the shortage of workers involved in the



maintenance of public facili-

"We have taken into account assistance needed during the monitoring period of 24 months, which includes providing land, training infrastructure and other forms of temporary allowances," he told reporters after launching the IPR initiative in Ampang here yesterday. Selangor Menteri Besar Datuk
