HEED SPENDING LIMIT

Rafizi: Madani Economy won't need extra expenditure

KUALA LUMPUR: The implementation of the Madani Economy does not require any additional expenditure this year and will still be in accordance with government expenditure allocations tabled in the 2023 Budget, said Economy Minister Rafizi Ramli.

He said the government will spend based on the allocations approved by Parliament and follow the expenditures set under the budget.

"We have to spend according to what has been approved by Par-liament. We cannot just spend as we like, but must instead follow certain rules," he said on the side-lines of the National Tax Con-

ference 2023 here yesterday.

He said the government, for example, could reprioritise budgets approved for certain projects or ministries.
"We can prioritise and rear-

range. So, the government can spend more on certain areas that it thinks are important for real-ising the Madani economy with out overshooting the set budget,"

The Madani Economy Frame-

work announced by Prime Min-ister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim on July 27 was aimed at making the country a leading economy in Asia and improving the people's

quality of life.
On April 5, 2023, the Dewan Ngara passéd the Supply Bill 2023 (the 2023 Budget) with an allocation of RM388.1 billion, comprising RM289.1 billion for operating expenditure and RM99 billion for development expenditure, including RM2 billion as contingency savings. Rernama
