## Govt targeting economic growth of 5% per year

The prime minister said the unity government is preparing the country for phase two of the 12MP

themed "Sustainable. Prosperous, High-Income" From with three main focus areas: front strengthening sustainability, page developing a prosperous society and progressing towards becoming a high-income

Anwar said 12 measures and 71 key initiatives have been introduced to ensure success in achieving the targets, adding that the government has targeted a

jump in economic growth of at least 5% per year during the 12MP.

He said the government will strengthen sectors and industries with high growth and value in order to accelerate the economic structure reforms covering industries based on energy transition, industries based on technology and digital, highvalue electrical and electronic industries, agricultural and agrobased industries and rare earth industries.

Anwar said the National Energy Transition Roadmap has identified 10 strategic and high-impact flagship projects with an expected investment of RM25 billion, creating 23,000 high-quality job opportunities and reducing 10,000 gigagrammes of carbon dioxide equivalent per year.

He also said that a new National Mineral Policy will be drafted to drive comprehensive development of the mineral industry based on the principles of sustainability and responsibility.

The government will also develop a policy of banning the export of rare earth raw materials to avoid exploitation and loss of resources, thus guaranteeing maximum returns for the country."

UALA LUMPUR: The governme has raised the expenditure ceiling of the 12th Malaysia Plan (12MP) by RM15 billion, bringing the total location to RM415 billion. Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim

Anwar said the review will include policies, strategies and targets, comprehensively taking into account the development gap between city and rural areas as well as the rich-poor gap that still exists, swelling debt, limited fiscal space and the slow transition of the economic structure.

He said the 12MP allocated RM400 billion to finance extension and new development.

to finance extension and new development projects for a period of five years. "For the first two years, the government

spent a total of 34%. In 2021, the total development expenditure will only be as much as RM64.3 billion while in 2022, the

much as RM64.3 billion while in 2022, the amount will be as much as RM71.6 billion."

Anwar said during the first half of 2023, the country's gross domestic product (GDP) recorded an increase of 4.2%, supported by private sector activities and good trade, Bernama reported.

He said the performance of the labour market was getting better, with a higher productivity rate, which was 3.7% per year for

the period 2021 to 2022,

the period 2021 to 2022, while the unemployment rate dropped to 3.5% in the second quarter of 2023.

"The inflation rate in July 2023 has dropped to 2%, the lowest recorded in 24 months.

"Gross national income per capita higher, namely at US\$12,035 (RM\$2,988) in 2022 compared with US\$10,191 (RM\$42,838) in 2020.

Anwar also said the well-being index of Malaysians, which measures the level of economic and social well-being of the people, has increased by 1.3% per year.

He added that the income of the people had also improved, with the average monthly household income increasing to RM8.479 in 2022 from

RM7,901 in 2019.
