Passport-free travel with QR code system mulled

MALAYSIA-SINGAPORE INITIATIVE

OR CODE SYSTEM MULLED

Move will support development of Johor-Singapore special economic zone, say ministers

JOHOR BARU

ALAYSIA and Singapore are exploring ways to implement passport-free travel at land checkpoints through a QR code system.

In a joint statement yesterday, Malaysia's Economy Ministry and Singapore's Trade and Indus-try Ministry said passport-free travel was among the initiatives aimed at supporting the devel-opment of the Johor-Singapore special economic zone (JS-SEZ).

"The adoption and implementation of a passport-free QR code clearance system on both sides will facilitate more expeditious clearance of people at land check-points," the ministries said.

Another initiative is establish-ing a one-stop business and investment centre to facilitate the application for approvals and licences for Singapore businesses to set up in Johor.

There are also plans to digi-

talise the cargo clearance process at land checkpoints, as well as facilitating Malaysia-Singapore renewable energy cooperation to

drive economic growth. Economy Minister Rafizi Ramli said the JS-SEZ was an unprece-dented opportunity to enhance the cross-border flow of goods and people, bolster the business ecosystem and enhance the eco-nomic attractiveness of both Johor and Singapore.
"I have full confidence the JS-

SEZ initiative is the beginning of a transformation in the economies of both countries, fostering unparalleled relations and prosper-

paralleled relations and prosper-ity for Malaysia and Singapore."
Singapore Trade and Industry Minister Gan Kim Yong said the JS-SEZ would serve as a bridge for both countries to tap into each other's strengths and seize opportunities for growth.

"I look forward to the JS-SEZ agreement and the benefits for our businesses and people."

Both parties said the JS-SEZ

would ride on Johor's strong growth and Singapore's significant investments in the region.

Last month, Johor Menteri Be-

sar Datuk Onn Hafiz Ghazi pro-

posed the implementation of a QR code system like Singapore's at the Sultan Iskandar Customs, Immigration and Quarantine Complex.

He said measures such as mul-tiple entry visas, special passes and sufficient workforce from the immigration and customs departments were crucial to ensure the smooth flow of workers, visitors and merchandise between Johor and Singapore.

Earlier, Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim and his Singapore counterpart, Lee Hsien Loong, witnessed the signing of a memorandum of understanding on the development of the JS-

SEZ between Rafizi and Gan. In 2022, Johor recorded RM70.6 billion in investments across various sectors, including electrical and electronics, medical equip-ment, food manufacturing and data centres.

Singapore was Johor's secondlargest foreign investor from January to June 2022, accounting for about 70 per cent of Johor's total foreign direct investment in the manufacturing sector.
