"All secretaries-general, direc-tors-general and vice-chancel-lors must submit a report, apart from other matters, on what has been done to increase awareness and literacy of AI among their

staff at their ministeries and stu-

dents at their universities.

"Today, we are emphasising on literacy following the launch of the 'AI Untuk Rakyat' pro-

gramme.
"Therefore, one month from now, I want everyone to submit a

report on the progress.
"I would like to also extend the 'challenge' to the members of the cabinet."

AI Untuk Rakyat is a self learn-

ing online programme created to increase understanding and awareness among the public of AI. The programme, which can be

accessed via www.ai.gov.my, has two modules, namely AI Aware and AI Appreciate.
